From the Vicar

At this time of year, we begin to be bombarded with images and ideas as to how we create the perfect Christmas? Newsagents' shelves are usually lined with glossy magazines packed with advice on how to plan the best Christmas ever, with mouth-watering recipes to cook, delicious drinks, and suggestions for the perfect present for each member of the family.

There will be beautiful pictures of the tastefully decorated and garlanded home, resplendent with huge Christmas tree, myriad sparkling lights and jewel-



coloured baubles. Then there are photographs of the ideal family who all look gorgeous in the latest evening wear or otherwise impeccably presented in Christmas pyjamas against the background of a glowing hearth. Angelic looking children beam behind piles of artistically wrapped presents and there is not a sniffling nose or tantrum in sight.

Our television screens are also filled with stylised images or advice on the perfect Christmas. Big stores compete for the best and most moving Christmas advert – there is usually a theme in which Christmas is "saved" against all the odds. The message being that the department store or big supermarket will provide for all our needs in order to enable the "perfect" Christmas.

Many of us will be looking forward to celebrating Christmas with our loved ones. That shared experience is important. I suspect for most of us, our family Christmases are enjoyable but not perfect however hard we might work at the preparations. Family life is full of the mess of human behaviour-: the overtired and overexcited children, overworked parents, churlish teenagers, embarrassing aunties and other challenging relatives. Not to mention the things forgotten in the busyness of seasonal preparations coupled with the irritable family member who is experiencing a hangover or seasonal cold.

The true image of Christmas is however, not glossy or sparkling, but that of the simple stable at Bethlehem. Not wrapped in garish wrapping paper and tied up with ribbon but a baby wrapped in simple swaddling clothes laid in a manger, because this family has nowhere else to go.

This is the joyful mystery that lies at the heart of Christmas: God becoming human in the birth of Jesus Christ.

This I would like to invite you all to discover – or rediscover – the good news of God's saving love as revealed in the birth of Jesus. It is an opportunity to each of us to ponder in our hearts – as Mary did – what the extraordinary events of the first Christmas might mean for us now and in the years ahead.

Do join us at a church as we hear about the true meaning of Christmas through traditional readings and carols. Details of all the Christmas services in the Benefice are listed in this edition of Octavo or in a special Christmas card which will be distributed to as many households as possible — look out for yours! We are planning a special welcome for children with activities and an invitation to come along dressed as their favourite nativity character.

The perfect Christmas is all about meeting with God made man. God in Jesus who knows and experiences what it is like to be fully human. God who loves us so much, is still prepared to reach out to us however far off we may be. Jesus is the gift to us and fully embraces our less than perfect humanity. The only preparation we need to make is to open our hearts and minds to receive the free gift of life changing love. The promised feast to which we are invited is more perfect and beautiful than we can ever imagine or plan for ourselves. The invitation is extended to all, we just need the humility to accept it.

For many people we know, Christmas is a difficult time. Their Christmas will be nothing like the images with which we are bombarded in the media. For some people, Christmas makes the loss of a loved one even more difficult to bear. Some families will be struggling for different reasons including low wages, debt, illness, and rising fuel bills. As Christians there are many ways in which we can reach out to those who need our help. Many of us will be motivated to give to charities and donate to the foodbank. Others will invite the person who may be bereaved or lonely to join their celebrations. Whatever we do we are challenged to think about what we can do to bring the true meaning of Christmas to our neighbours and the wider community. After all, love, just like the Christmas tins of chocolate, is for sharing.

I wish you a Christmas and New Year filled with the blessings of the joy, hope, love and peace of Christ.

Lord of the journey, with Mary and Joseph, with shepherds and wise men, Lam Bethlehem Bound. Bring me, with them to worship before Jesus


