From the Vicar

Dear Friends

A very Happy Easter season to you all.

It seems that nowadays we live in a society which struggles with finding the truth. A society which is sceptical and which believes that the news we hear is likely to be fake. People are more suspicious about information that comes from previously well-respected news channels and government sources, whilst social media is awash with conspiracy theories.



In recent weeks, there has been much media speculation about the whereabouts and well-being of the Princess of Wales especially following the family Mother's Day photograph that was released which subsequently was found to be edited by the princess herself. Now we learn that Catherine has been undergoing treatment for cancer which she is coming to terms with herself, whilst doing her best to explain it to her young children.

Media attention of any sort can be cruel and unforgiving, and we hope and pray that the Princess of Wales along with King Charles will both be given the peace and respite that they need for a full recovery from their illnesses. Our prayers are with them as we also pray for others we know of who are undergoing similar medical treatment.

We might wonder how the media in the 21st century may have dealt with stories of Jesus's resurrection. We might suspect that there would be accusations of fake news and any sightings of Jesus would be assumed to be doctored photographs or some kind of CGI. His followers would most likely have been regarded with scepticism because surely nobody sensible believes in the resurrection of Jesus?

We might wonder too as to how easy it was to get hold of the truth in first century Palestine? It would be reasonable to imagine that there might be all sorts of rumours and conspiracy theories flying around in Jerusalem at that time. Some of you may have seen the film "Risen" with Joseph Fiennes which tells the story of a Roman Tribune who is sent by Pilate to investigate the disappearance of Jesus's body and dig it up from wherever it has been supposedly concealed by his followers. The Tribune never finds the body of Jesus, but does go on to have his own encounter with the risen Jesus, which means that he is never quite the same again.

So, if Thomas needed a personal encounter with God to truly believe, do we? Paul did. I know that I did to believe in the reality of Jesus. I rather suspect that is the same for all of us. It seems, however, that we all experience God in different ways and sometimes we encounter God in ways which are so gentle and subtle we can hardly believe them, let alone want to share that experience with others.

So if you have doubts, like Thomas did, take them honestly to God in prayer, Jesus can cope with them just as he coped with Thomas's and he will respond to you in the way you need, but maybe not in the way you expect.

Believing in the resurrection is not an optional extra for Christians because without it, Christianity is merely a moral code. Through his death and resurrection Jesus both reconciled us to God and overcame death, which means we too can have eternal life. A truth to be shared with all.
